

## What is Truth?

*According to the World English Bible (WEB)*

Truth, in the biblical sense, is more than mere factual accuracy; it is the very nature and expression of God Himself. In the World English Bible (WEB), truth is presented as eternal, unchanging, and foundational to a relationship with God. The clearest declaration of truth comes from Jesus Himself, who said, *“I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me”* (John 14:6 WEB). This statement reveals that truth is not just a concept—it is a person. Jesus embodies truth in His being, His words, and His actions.

Throughout Scripture, truth is shown to be inseparable from God’s Word. In John 17:17, Jesus prays to the Father, saying, *“Sanctify them in your truth. God’s Word is not only true but is the means by which believers are purified and shaped into His likeness.

You will know the truth, and the truth will make you free”* (John 8:31–32 WEB). This shows that truth is not only liberating but is also something to be known through relationship and obedience. Truth is not abstract; it is something revealed through remaining in Christ’s teachings.

In contrast, deception is shown to come from the devil. Jesus says of Satan, *“When he speaks a lie, he speaks on his own; for he is a liar, and the father of lies”* (John 8:44 WEB). This stark contrast between truth and lies underscores the spiritual battle between God’s truth and Satan’s deception. Those who reject truth align themselves with the father of lies, while those who embrace it align themselves with the God of truth.

Ultimately, Pilate’s cynical question, *“What is truth?”* (John 18:38 WEB), comes after Jesus declares, *“I have come into the world, that I should testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice”* (John 18:37 WEB). Jesus identifies Himself as the ultimate witness to truth. To be “of the truth” is to listen to Jesus, to believe in Him, and to follow Him.

In conclusion, according to the World English Bible, truth is not merely a principle but the very person of Jesus Christ. It is found in the Word of God, sets people free, and separates them from falsehood. To seek truth is to seek Christ, listen to His voice, and walk in His Word.
